- CONTROL
 accepting responsibility, having commitment, instruction and supervision.
- CO-OPERATION working with/ work between individuals and groups.
- COMMUNICATION spoken, written and visible.

Ways to improve Health and Safety in your Workplace

- Follow all safety procedures and rules.
- Equip yourself with proper training.
- Report any hazards.
- Keep your work area clean and tidy.
- Wear protective clothing that has been provided.
- ◆ If you have an illness or condition, make sure your supervisor is aware of it.
- Discuss any concerns you may have with your health and safety representative.
- Take your work seriously.
- If you are involved in an accident, report it immediately.



 Wash your hands with soap and water upon entry/ use an alcohol based sanitizer.




 Avoid close contact with people . Maintain Social Distancing (6ft apart).

- Draws attention to nearby hazards/potentially dangerous situations.
- Reminds both employees & visitors of safety guidelines/ equipment before entering an area.
- Identify the location of emergency equipment.
